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Mulberry Wood Wharf EY Outdoor Provision

Our Outdoor area is a space where children can play, learn, create, take risks and explore in a safe and stimulating environment with the support of engaged and interested adults. We aim to ensure that our Outdoors provides a considered balance between offered activities and child-initiated play, as well as a balance between the provision of natural objects and materials, and opportunities to bring meaningful, purposeful text into the environment.

To be able to offer this balance, we have made a provisional plan for the school year which details both our offered curriculum and continuous provision. While we do wish to ensure a broad range of offered learning experiences for our children, we also passionately believe in child-led learning and are committed to being flexible with our planning so that we can follow our children's interests and ideas as they are sparked.

The following pages give an overview of our yearly entitlement, linked where possible to the over-arching themes of the terms and also the seasons; for example an outdoor igloo to enhance our 'What if Little Red Riding Hood lived in the Arctic?' topic and provision of gardening equipment, seeds and plants in the summer terms.

How our plan works:

- Teachers use the yearly overview to inform medium-term planning
- The team refer to medium term plans to inform weekly planning and expand topics/areas by planning specific activities and/or equipment to be provided outdoors that week
- Each day, the outdoor activities are set up according to the weekly plan, alongside the continuous provision offered some of which is permanently accessible to children and some of which is stored in the shed for practical reasons
- Staff will keep a tally of how often the stored-away equipment is made available and will evaluate how evenly spread this provision is throughout the term
- Staff will take a photograph of our set-ups each morning, or when appropriate, to continue building our bank of ideas. These are stored in EYFS Provision Ideas, Outdoors
- The outdoor planning board is available to all staff to record observations of children's play and ideas as well as any questions, logistical or stock issues. This board is photographed at the end of the week to keep a record of information which can then be used for future planning and assessment

Still to consider: risk assessment e.g. planks for ski-ing, tidying agreements (sand etc!) and what makes meaningful text outside
