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

# Reading



You may remember in a previous newsletter when I shared some fascinating statistics on children who are read to during the week and the number of words they learn, retain and use.

The word gap:

# At 5 years old

Never read to -4,622 words

1-2 times a week – 63, 570 words

3-5 times a week – 169, 520 words

Daily - 296, 600 words

Five books a day - 1, 483,300 words



Parents will be going through the stages now where their child will be applying their reading and phonics skills to read words independently, this is fantastic! However, there still needs to be many opportunities for you and your child to enjoy listening to and reading books together, this really supports their language development and comprehension on why stories are structured the way they are. Exploring why the author has chosen certain words and illustrations helps children understand purpose, meaning and inference which are important reading skills to practice and have!

## Open door policy

Class teachers also love talking to families, if there is something quite pressing that you would like the class teacher to know but they are unavailable then please let the admin team know or a senior leader who will get the message to them.

## **Attendance**

It is a new term and yet again we are striving for a whole school target of **97%** weekly attendance! This is an absolute priority for the school, we are currently sitting around 92%!!! Each week the class with the best attendance will take the attendance trophy back to class to admire for the following week.

### Extended leave

Please note that requests for extended leave from school will be unauthorised unless in exceptional circumstances. There have been many requests for extended leave in the autumn term, which have mostly been unauthorised. The school would never authorise a family holiday.

## **DfE Guidance on Attendance**

The Department for Education (DfE) guidance clearly states that children should not take time off school for leave during term time. Regular attendance is crucial for maintaining progress in learning and missed school days can significantly impact a child's education. We kindly ask for

your support in ensuring your child attends school consistently so they can make the most of their learning opportunities.

#### **Illness**

We understand that children do become unwell, and it is best that they stay at home and rest and recover. It also prevents any unnecessary spread of infection. The NHS website is a good location for offering advice but in general:

- Please keep your child at home if they have a temperature, it is a sign that they are fighting an infection
- If your child has sickness, diarrhea, or both, then you must keep them at home for 48 hours since their last moment of sickness or diarrhea
- Please contact the school if your child is going to be absent so we can update our registration system. You can do this via telephone or email.

## **Punctuality**

Thank you to parents for getting their child to school on time last term, we know how busy mornings can be for families. The children are much more settled and calmer when they arrive with their peers. A reminder of the registration times is:

8am: Breakfast club starts

8:50 – 09:00: Doors open for children to arrive

After 9am: Parents will be asked to fill in the lateness sheet, this is so we can track and ensure all children have been entered on the register

09:05am: The register will close

After 09:05am: pupils will be marked as late

3.30pm: End of the school day

4.30pm: End of school clubs

6.00pm: final collection at Premier Wraparound

### **Playground Update**

We are excited to announce that we plan to open the playground very soon! The necessary risk assessments are in place, and we have made sure that clear communication and procedures for staff are ready to ensure a safe environment for all children. We will keep you updated with further details as we approach the opening. Thank you for your continued support!

## **Site Update**

We understand that many parents have been eager for an update on the completion of the school building. At this time, I do not have a specific completion date, but please know that I will

share the latest information with you as soon as I receive it. I want to ensure that any updates I provide are accurate and reliable. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

#### Homework

Class teachers will be sending out their half term letters this week detailing the upcoming learning that will be taking place in class. Please take the time to read these. Included in the letters will be details on how you can support your child at home this half term, including a home project linked to a class topic.

The Government believe that a sensible programme of homework activities for children in Key Stage 1 should be designed on average to take about 1 hour a week. At Key Stage 2 the demand should gradually increase so that by Years 5 and 6 children are spending about 30 minutes a day (two and a half hours a week) on homework. A reasonable time request is to be made of children, taking into consideration that several of our children may have out of school commitments.

At Mulberry Wood Wharf Primary we support home learning by:

1. Requesting daily reading

As mentioned above, this is the most important homework for our children to do because it helps them to:

- Improve their spoken English, their English vocabulary and awareness of grammar
- Become more fluent readers with improved comprehension
- Develop their writing skills.
- 2. Spelling practice in Y1 and Y2
- 3. Home projects linked to class topics, sent out by the class teacher
- 4. Workshops for parents

Teachers will be hosting workshops this term, we hope all parents will attend. Workshops are planned to be engaging and interactive and with purpose so that parents leave feeling well informed about the teaching and learning practice in school. The workshops always have tips for parents and ideas on how to support their child at home.

#### Worksheets

We prefer not to use worksheets as a tool for homework, they are not always developmentally appropriate for young children because they can be abstract in presenting a concept. Young children learn best by hands-on, concrete experiences. We are also very mindful of how much printing we do in school and have moved away from printing resources unless it enhances learning significantly.

# Online learning

Class teachers will be informing parents of good online learning tools. We are also developing our online learning platform through the website and have already added some resources here Mulberry Learn – Mulberry Wood Wharf
