This week, the children have had an exciting and actionpacked time outdoors, engaging in a variety of fun and creative activities. The children spent plenty of time playing with water, splashing, pouring, and experimenting with different containers. It was not only a sensory experience but also an opportunity for the children to practice coordination and develop their fine motor skills. They worked together to fill, transfer, and balance the water.

In the weaving station, the children had the chance to explore textures and colours, working with ribbons of various lengths to weave them through the gate. This task really helped to strengthen their fine motor skills, with each twist, pull, and loop offering valuable practice in hand-eye coordination and focus. The outdoor easel became a favourite spot for some, as they used it to create vibrant self-portraits. Each child captured their own unique features using a variety of colours and strokes. Some even used chalk to mark designs on the floor around the easel. It was wonderful to see the children reflecting on their own identities and expressing themselves visually, all while having fun with their peers.

The children have begun their winter forest boxes, diving into the project with enthusiasm. Their first step has been to paint their boxes a crisp white, creating a soft, snowy backdrop. Once the white paint has dried, they begin adding their winter pieces, using an assortment of materials to bring their forest scenes to life. We are excited for parents/carers to see the finished product.

This week we gave a royal welcome to HM Queen Camilla at one of our newest Mulberry schools. Nikita gave the queen a very warm and confident handshake which he has told me he has learnt in his judo lessons! I'm sure the memories of the day and the occasion we'll be memorable in years to come.

In Maths, we've started exploring multiplication and division. The children have been identifying equal and unequal groups and using stem sentences to describe how many equal groups there are and how many items are in each group. This foundational knowledge will prepare them for understanding the times symbol, linking repeated addition with multiplication.

In PSHE, the children began an exciting group challenge: designing their dream gardens. Working collaboratively, they've been listening to each other's ideas, assigning roles, and encouraging one another to create projects they are proud of. It's been heartening to see their teamwork in action. Special mention goes to Maria for her kindness in supporting her teammate with compliments on their work. The final designs will be completed next week, and we can't wait to see the results!

Boom wackers and African drums were some popular choices. The children practiced turn taking and their listening skills to create music as a class. Tuneful music filled our corridors as they played together as a school community in class.

There was much excitement as pupils worked on their artwork. Pupils explored a variety of methods to create texture on a patterned surface. They first used oil pastels to draw their repeated patterns using vibrant colours. Next, they used wool to created different layers and textures. The process was very sticky as they used PVA glue, but the class are extremely proud of their final outcomes.

Year 1 celebrated National Storytelling week by visiting the Idea Store and meeting Minnie Wilkinson. They loved listening to her stories and engaging in the creative workshop.

This week in Geography we learnt about two different types of trees called deciduous and evergreen trees. We know evergreen trees keep their green leaves all year, even in winter! Whereas the leaves on deciduous trees change colour and fall off during the winter months. During the weekend when you are out and about, keep your eyes open as you'll be able to spot lots of deciduous and evergreen trees!

In Art we continued with our exploration of wool. First, we created a patterned surface with coloured pastels drawing lots of marks such as zig zags, dashes, dots and swirls. Then we created texture over the patterned surface using wool. Next week we will create a self portrait combining awardwinning our Art skills from the past few weeks.

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
