A special mention goes to our Year 2 Elephant Class, who are taking things to the next level. Next week, they will be visiting the Houses of Parliament, a place where national and global change happens.

It's so important to me that throughout their primary years, our pupils understand that they have the power to make positive change. Just like our country, Mulberry Wood Wharf is built on the principles of democracy and respect. Just this week Year 1 have been learning about inspiring figures such as Mary Anning and David Attenborough, and they learn about other key figures all through their primary years – through this our pupils can see how small actions can lead to bigger changes.

Blue Whale and Tiger Class have been learning...

The children had a fantastic time celebrating St. Patrick's Day, embracing the festive spirit with creativity and fun. They made colourful hats using traditional Irish colours, proudly wearing their green, white, and orange creations as they joined in the celebrations. Lively Irish music filled the room as they danced joyfully, moving to the rhythm with big smiles on their faces.

Alongside the festivities, the children also practiced their phonics sounds, eagerly taking turns pretending to be the teacher and pupil. This interactive approach worked wonderfully, as they helped each other learn new Set 3 sounds, making learning both enjoyable and effective.

Lastly, the children also practiced their cooking skills by making delicious pitta pizzas. They carefully used their cutting and spreading skills to prepare their pizzas, enjoying the hands-on experience and the homemade taste of their delicious creations.

Elephant Class have been learning...

In Design and Technology, the children have been learning about the properties of materials, focusing on absorbency and water resistance. To support this, we carried out an exciting investigation inspired by the question: What are the properties of waterproof paper? The children tested four different types of paper—plain paper, kitchen towel, foil, and newspaper—to discover how they reacted to water droplets. They carefully observed and recorded their findings in their books.

We then extended this learning by experimenting with ways to make newspaper waterproof. Each child tested wax crayon, oil crayon, chalk, and felt pen to see which created a barrier between the paper fibres and the water. Their conclusions showed that wax and oil crayons were the most effective! Using these tools, the children designed and waterproofed their own origami newspaper hats, combining creativity with scientific thinking. Look out for the photos of their proud creations in their books!

In Maths, Elephant Class has been learning about length and height. We explored measuring with both nonstandard and standard units, discovering that centimetres can be shortened to "cm" and learning the fact that there are always 100 centimetres in 1 metre. The children practiced estimating distances and were excited to find out that our school hall is 19 metres long, with Mikaeel making the closest guess! Using this knowledge, we compared and ordered various heights and lengths.

Why not explore measuring at home this weekend? Will you use standard or non-standard units?

A big thank you to all parents who attended meetings this week. It was wonderful to celebrate your child's progress and achievements. A reminder that our trip to the Houses of Parliament is on **Tuesday, 25th March**—children should arrive at school by **8:30am**. This promises to be a memorable experience!

Panda Class have been learning...

Panda class have thoroughly enjoyed learning about Sir David Attenborough. They have been learning about his life and achievements. They explored his work on wildlife documentaries and his efforts in conservation. The pupils were amazed at how he has inspired the world to take care of our planet and how to protect wildlife and their habitats.

In Maths, Pupils have been learning about measurement. They measured objects using non-standard units like paperclips and cubes. This hands-on approach helps them understand measurement and comparison, building foundational skills in estimation and spatial awareness. Measuring with items like paperclips and cubes encourages creativity and understanding of flexible measurement. Pupils continued to measure object with a ruler to find measurements.

Pupils have learnt about the different animal groups and are able to compare classification of animals using a Venn diagram. Pupils have been looking at similarities and differences. This week has been full of sparking curiosity and a love for discovery, and it has been wonderful to see pupils engaged in their learning. Well done Panda Class.

This week we were treated to amazing drama performances by students from Mulberry Girls School, who brought three traditional tales to life. We absolutely loved joining in with the performances and had so much fun First, part of the experience. The energy and creativity from the students made the stories even more exciting, and it was a great way to learn and enjoy some classic tales in a whole new way!

In Art we explored the skill of cross-stitching. First, we used a pencil to draw the initial letter in our name. We then poked holes using a pencil on our pencil markings. Finally, we use the needle and thread to create stitches that went all around our letter. We will use this skill of cross-stitching next week on different materials.


In our Maths lessons, we've been exploring length and height using non-standard units of measurement, such as hands and paper clips. This helps us understand the concept of measuring and comparing different sizes in a more hands-on way. After that, we learned how to use a ruler to measure objects accurately in centimeters (cm). We learnt that when measuring with a ruler, it's important to start at the 0 mark and count all the way to the end of the object to find its exact length or height. This way, we can understand how long or tall something is in a standard unit of measure.


