### Elephant Class have been learning...

This week has been full of exciting events in Elephant Class!

In RE, we revisited the story of Passover from last term and engaged in a thought-provoking debate. Children made persuasive arguments about whether Moses should continue to follow and trust God or give up his fight against Pharaoh, leaving the Jews in slavery. It was wonderful to hear compelling reasons on both sides, showing how deeply the children considered their arguments. Additionally, the children confidently retold the Easter story and identified key Christian symbols like the cross, representing Jesus' sacrifice, the tomb for his resurrection, and the candle as a symbol of Jesus as the light for Christians.

Our learning about debate extended beyond the classroom with a memorable trip to the Houses of Parliament! The children explored the historic building, including the King's Robing Room, and learned how its colours represent the House of Commons (green), the House of Lords (red), and the monarchy (gold). They asked thoughtful questions, explored feely bags to identify mystery objects, and even put the steps of making a law in order. A big thank you to the parents who joined us—your support made this experience unforgettable!

In English, we are preparing to write recounts of our trip to the Houses of Parliament, building on the skills we used for our Museum of Docklands recounts. This week, the children have been busy planning their writing and will create their independent recounts next week.

I have been astounded at the creative and informative Amazon rainforest Home projects that I have seen from the children, I can't wait to showcase them next week at our KS1 Showcase.

# Lion & Panda Class have been learning...

This week in Maths we have been using scales to learn about weight and mass. We have used key vocabulary such as heavier, lighter and balanced to compare the weight of objects. Using this knowledge, we learnt about measuring the mass of an object using nonstandard forms. For example, the mass of a banana is 7 cubes, and the mass of a ball was 9 cubes. This meant that ball was heavier than the banana. We have moved onto learning about capacity and volume. Learning that capacity is how much something can hold, and volume is the amount it has in it. Children were confidently able to use the correct terms such as 'full, empty, half full, half empty' and demonstrate it.

In English Lion class children are becoming more confident writers. We have been using the think it, say it, write it strategy to write a retell of our key text 'Thank you Omu.' We will continue to use finger spaces, full stops and capital letters in our writing and remember to form our letters correctly.









Panda Class have been immersed in the delightful story of *Thank You, Omu*. They have been planning and writing their own retell of the story, focusing on sequencing events and expressing gratitude, just like Omu. It's been heartwarming to see their creativity and writing composition grow as they bring the story to life in their own words. Pupils are increasingly becoming confident to new rich vocabulary and phrases that they have heard in the story.

In Maths, our focus has been on understanding mass and comparing weights. The children have been using balancing scales and cubes to measure and compare the mass of different objects. This hands-on activity has helped them grasp the concept of weight in a fun and interactive way.

We have started to receive home projects this week and we cannot wait to see more next week. The long weekend would be a good opportunity to make sure your child has completed this and is ready to share next week.


